**Summer Intern #1** – We will be hiring a youth summer intern (18-30 year-old) to help us with our computer/social media needs. # **Visioning Project Notes**

May 8, 2021

The meeting convened with prayer.

A. **Member Outreach**: The group resumed discussing the difficulties Saint Andrew's confronts with its present member outreach. Presently, each Elder is responsible for his/her "Elder District." The idea is that the elders have regular contact with the members in their respective Elder Districts. However, not all Elders have the aptitude and/or sufficient time carry out this responsibility. The group agreed that the current set-up is not working and never really has.

### Possible solutions include:

- 1. Holding a worship service focused on teaching the congregation about the role and responsibilities of Elders pursuant to PCC polity
- 2. Making all Session meetings open to the congregation
- 3. Holding several "Meet an elder" zoom gatherings. This would be something relaxed and fun along the line of the Shrove Tuesday event.
- 4. Larger Elder Districts each assigned 2 elders.
- 5. Shifting the outreach responsibilities to a separate "body" that would be dedicated to member outreach.
  - a. This body would include all of the work presently assigned to the pastoral care committee:
    - i. Birthday cards
    - ii. Birthday calls
    - iii. Get well cards
    - iv. Hospital visits
    - v. Shut-in visits
    - vi. Out-reach with the loss of a loved one

- b. This new "body" would also undertake coordinating care for families/individuals in time of concern such as providing meals or drives. Sheila Black has started a "Caring Ministry" for this purpose.
- c. Additionally, this group would be responsible for fostering greater fellowship within the congregation. With Covid restrictions, Saint Andrew's has really struggled to find any way to maintain and build friendships. We had our online Shove Tuesday meal together which was a success. But such activities require effort to coordinate and to promote and someone has to do this work if we are to have them.
- d. Maintain membership lists
- e. Provide immediate follow-up outreach to visitors
- **B. Membership**: The Visioning Project raised the need to provide options for church membership. It appears that there is no system in place to move adherents to members. Should we arrange to hold member classes?
- **C. Summer at Saint Andrew's**: With smaller worship attendance, summer will offer opportunities to explore ideas we might want to incorporate come this fall.
- **D. Physical Building Up-Date**: There was no report this time on the progress of reimagining how SAPC might revamp its physical space to provide long-term for the ministry needs of the congregation.

The meeting closed with prayer.

## D. Scripture Readings for the May 23rd Worship Service

### Psalm 104:24-34, 35b

104:24 O LORD, how manifold are your works! In wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures.

104:25 Yonder is the sea, great and wide, creeping things innumerable are there, living things both small and great.

104:26 There go the ships, and Leviathan that you formed to sport in it.

104:27 These all look to you to give them their food in due season;

104:28 when you give to them, they gather it up; when you open your hand, they are filled with good things.

104:29 When you hide your face, they are dismayed; when you take away their breath, they die and return to their dust.

104:30 When you send forth your spirit, they are created; and you renew the face of the ground.

104:31 May the glory of the LORD endure forever; may the LORD rejoice in his works-

- 104:32 who looks on the earth and it trembles, who touches the mountains and they smoke.
- 104:33 I will sing to the LORD as long as I live; I will sing praise to my God while I have being.
- 104:34 May my meditation be pleasing to him, for I rejoice in the LORD.
- 104:35b Bless the LORD, O my soul. Praise the LORD!

#### Romans 8:22-27

- 8:22 We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now;
- 8:23 and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies.
- 8:24 For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen?
- 8:25 But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.
- 8:26 Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words.
- 8:27 And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

#### Acts 2:1-21

- 2:1 When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place.
- 2:2 And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting.
- 2:3 Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them.
- 2:4 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.
- 2:5 Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem.
- 2:6 And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each.
- 2:7 Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans?
- 2:8 And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language?
- 2:9 Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia,
- 2:10 Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome,

both Jews and proselytes,

- 2:11 Cretans and Arabs--in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power."
- 2:12 All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?"
- 2:13 But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."
- 2:14 But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say.
- 2:15 Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning.
- 2:16 No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:
- 2:17 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams.
- 2:18 Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy.
- 2:19 And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist.
- 2:20 The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day.
- 2:21 Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'
